



STEPS

Idea: What is your story about? Make a Quick Story Board Write the Story: 3 Part Story Mountain

1st Edit: Macro

Macro Edits: fix plot, story structure, scenes, character changes

Type the Story

(If you haven't already)

2nd Edit: Micro

Micro Edits: sentence level edits, formatting, grammar, spelling, punctuation

Trim Size, Page Count, Paper/Hardback KDP: Paperback - Minimum of 24 pg. Hardcover 76 pg Minimum

Decide on Illustrations

Watercolor, graphics, pencil, charcoal, markers, acrylics, crayons

Begin Illustrations/Cover Design Last

Find Beta Readers

Get an outsider's perspective: teacher, parent, friend, etc. to read your story and give you their feedback. This is a HUGE help to polish your book!

Scan/Upload Illustrations into Computer (if not using digital graphics)

WRITING


Show Don't Tell: Use descriptive words to make a mental picture that you can see just by reading the words.

Have a 3 main parts to your "story mountain" **STORY MOUNTAIN**



- 1. Beginning: Meet the characters, setting, show a typical day
- 2. Middle: Problem Happens Some sort of obstacle happens, a problem arises, this is the longest part of the story. Explain all the things the character tries to do to solve this problem, even failing at first.
 - a. Character almost gives up: seems like the hero cannot go on
 - b. Peak/Climax: The character(s) have a breakthrough and figure out how to solve the problem(s).
- 3. End: All of the story lines/characters get closure/solutions. You can leave some little things unanswered here for another story in the future.

PLOT GUIDE



MAIN PROBLEM

Introduce the problem quickly



FIRST OBSTACLE

something gets in the way of the character reaching their goal

MORE OBSTACLES

Each obstacle should become more difficult

CHARACTER GIVES UP


The character can't solve the main problem and considers giving up

BREAKTHROUGH

The character has an idea or another friendly character shows them the solution

PROBLEM SOLVED

The main problem is resolved and leads to a happy ending





FORMATTING

- Children's, Recipe, Photography, Graphic Novel Books:
 - $\circ\,$ Word, Google Docs, etc. to write the content (FREEish)
 - Simplest: Canva.com for pulling it all together (FREE)
 - More In-Depth: Adobe In-Design (\$240/yr)
- Chapter Books:
 - $\circ\,$ Can Use Word, but can be diffcult
 - Atticus: \$147 (Mac & PC) Simple, most options
 - Scrivner: \$59 (Mac & PC) Simple, low cost
 - Vellum: \$249 (Mac Only)- Simple, but Mac Only
 - Adobe InDesign: (\$240/yr) Comprehensive, Costly

- Amazon KDP 1 PDF File of individual pages RGB, JPG of cover
- IngramSpark 1 PDF File of all separate pages CMYK, JPG Cover
- Draft2Digital
- Lulu

Pros

- All have Free ISBNs
- No upload fee

Cons

- Not as user friendly (IngramSpark, Draft2Digital, Lulu)
- Not as wide of range of distribution (Draft2Digital, Lulu, KDP
- Print On Demand services more expensive (not KDP)
